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












From the Principal



The World's Largest Mental Health Lesson

Last Friday, Randwick Boys' High School Year 10 students participated in The Worlds Largest Mental Health Lesson. Around 1500 Year 9 and 10 public high school students converged on Sydney Olympic Park, or joined a live cross to participate in the challenge, beating the current record set in the UK by a whopping 651 students.

The record attempt was to raise the discussion on mental health and introduce students to mental fitness and resilience through an interactive lesson for students.

Students were provided with many strategies to ensure they make mental health a priority. These included:



Enhancing awareness that mental wellbeing is a lifelong journey with ups and downs for everyone.

Enhancing awareness of how to maintain one's own mental wellbeing.

Improving your ability to start a conversation about mental wellbeing.



Increased confidence about seeking help if required.

Increased confidence in helping a friend in need.

The department's successful attempt to break the Guinness World Record for the World's Largest Mental Health Lesson was livestreamed to more than 9,000 students across NSW.

Thanks to Year 10, Mr Benson and Ms Munro for making our participation possible.

"We learnt that it's important to talk about mental health".

THE RAVEN'S TALE Written by Sebastian Presland



2018 School Vaccination Program

Third and Final Visit

Friday 23rd November 2018

Dear Parent/ Caregivers,

On **Friday, 23rd November**, the South Eastern Sydney Public Health Unit, will be at Randwick Boys' High School offering **Year 7 and 8 students** the following **vaccinations**;

Year 7 all Students

- Human Papillomavirus Vaccine (HPV) Dose 2.
- Catch up HPV Dose 1 for students who missed it on Visits 1 or 2 this year.
- Catch- up Diphtheria Tetanus & Pertussis (dTpa) 1 dose only for students who missed Visits 1 & 2.
- Catch up HPV Doses 1 for students who missed it on Visits 1 &/or 2.

Year 8 students (catch-up only):

• For those who have not completed a second Dose HPV course that commenced at school in Year 7 in 2017.

Year 10 Students:

• Meningococcal ACWY - 1 Dose. Meningococcal ACWY for students who missed the vaccination in term 2, 2018.

If you have begun the Vaccination Program the nurses have your son's vaccination cards (Years 7 & 8).

If your son has NOT received any vaccinations, including the Meningococcal vaccination and has NOT begun the School Vaccination Program at Randwick Boys' High School, he can begin the program on 23rd November. Your son will need to collect a consent form from Ms Cassar. You will need to complete the consent form and your son will need **to return the Consent Form to the Front Office or Ms Cassar by Tuesday 20th November**.

The clinic will be operating in the school hall, from 9am- 1pm.
