# White Ribbon Day at Randwick Girls' High School

Our sister school began its observance of White Ribbon Day 2018 with a formal assembly in its MPC on Wednesday morning. This year, four of our student representatives, Lotus Rahman, Feng Choe, Justin Loh and Beshal Joarder were invited to take the oath on behalf of Randwick Boys' High School.

The assembly was addressed by two of the founders of White Ribbon Australia, Dr Michael Salter and Libby Lloyd. As speakers, both addressed the scale of violence against women in our society, the impact on women's lives and steps that we all can take to reduce its prevalence. These sobering facts were well heeded by the audience.





In front of the audience, our students were invited to take the following pledge, "I will stand up, speak out, and act to prevent men's violence against women. This is my oath." The Girls' School community expressed its thanks to Beshal, Justin, Feng and Lotus for their willingness to take this step in their own lives as young men. I was very proud to have been a witness to this powerful gesture.

White Ribbon Day will be observed at RBHS on Friday 23, being the closest Friday to International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. Dozens of our students will be marching from Randwick to Coogee in the morning, and other events will be held during the day.

While passing the Boys' and Girls' Schools, parents are reminded to look out for the White Ribbon logo on prominent display, and to join us in having conversations on the issue with the young men in our lives.







#### Site establishment, demolition and early works - November update

This community notice provides an update on site establishment, demolition and early works for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment. Upcoming activities may be rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances or inclement weather.

We thank you for your patience as we undertake this important work.

#### Managing construction activities

### The health and safety of patients, families, visitors, staff, site workers and the community is our top priority.

We are working closely with Transport for NSW, CBD and South East Light Rail, Randwick City Council and UNSW to manage any impacts of construction in the area. Truck movements will be reduced during peak times to minimise impacts to local roads.

Strict environmental and planning regulations are in place to manage impacts including noise, dust and vibration.

#### Site hours

- Monday to Friday, 6:00am 6:00pm
- Saturday, 8:00am 5:00pm

Out of hours work, including Sunday work may be required subject to prior approval being granted by relevant authorities.

#### Work continuing during November

- Installation of hoarding
- Demolition
- Removal of hazardous building material and remediation of ground-fill
- Tree removal and clearing of vegetation
- Services isolation and disconnection
- Out of hours machinery deliveries.

#### About the project

The NSW Government is investing \$720 million to strengthen the Randwick health and education precinct as a world-leading centre for health and wellbeing, research, education and teaching.

A new Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building will be built in Stage 1 including an adult emergency department, extra beds, intensive care unit, and new operating theatres for the campus.

The Acute Services Building will open in 2022.



#### Upcoming activity

Activity	Description
Installation of Botany Street and Hospital Road site gates	Construction vehicle access to the site will predominantly occur through two access gates on Botany Street. Gate installation will occur late November commencing with Gate 2, adjacent to UNSW Gate 11. Gate 1 will then be installed to the north. Each gate will take approximately one week to install. An exit only gate that will be used by light vehicles will also be established on Hospital Road in early December.
	To establish the gates, restructuring of the existing kerb and creation of new driveway is required. This will include machine and manual digging, concreting and installation of the gates. All traffic lanes will remain open during this work. Pedestrian access will be maintained under the support of traffic control.



Delivery and installation of site accommodation

Site worker accommodation and project offices will be located within the site boundary. The sheds are built off site and initial deliveries will occur in early December with further deliveries in January. Preparation works for installation will commence in November.

The sheds will be delivered on an oversized vehicle and outside of standard work hours. The delivery will be made via the Botany Street gates under the support of traffic control. A crane positioned within the site boundary will lift the structures into place.

#### **Shack Tutoring Program Semester 1 2019**

The Shack tutoring program is a cost free tutoring service for students from Year 6 – Year 12. The program is run by The Shack Youth Services in conjunction with the University of NSW and has been operating since 1996. The Shack is non-for-profit organisation that helps vulnerable young people in our community who are experiencing hardship in their lives.

#### To meet the requirements of this program:

- Students need to be either living or going to school in the Randwick/Botany Council area
- Students are unable to access private tutoring due to financial hardship

#### How does it work?

- You will need to complete the attached enrolment form and either email, post or dropped off at The Shack between the enrolment period
- You will be matched with a volunteering UNSW student who is able to tutor you in the subject/s, day and time you have nominated
- You will meet your tutor after school at the UNSW for one hour one day a week
- The tutoring program runs in line of the UNSW semesters and does not run during school holidays and university exams
- On your first tutoring lesson, you will exchange mobile numbers with your tutor so if you are away for your lesson you can contact your tutor direct. Otherwise you are able to email or contact Shack Tutoring
- Failure to attend 3 consecutive lessons without communication will result in your removal from the program
- You are responsible for bringing your materials to each lesson such as text books, calculator, paper and pens
- We endeavour to match every student with a tutor but is not guaranteed
- Program information, advice and updates are communicated through email therefore it is essential to include an email address on your enrolment form
- Any late enrolments will automatically be put on a waiting list
