Thomas Kelly Foundation

The Thomas Kelly Foundation is a foundation formed in honour of Thomas Kelly, an 18 year old, tragically killed in a cowardly one-punch assault in July 2012. Thomas' family bonded together after this tragic loss to advocate and support young people with their "Take Kare" initiative, which centres on the ideologies of mateship and compassion, and calls upon friends and strangers to ensure the safety of all young people.



The Thomas Kelly Foundation has also developed a second program, "Stay Kind", dedicated to the memory of their other son, Stuart Kelly. Stuart ended his life in 2016, a result of his overnight attendance at St. Paul's College, Sydney University. Stuart had spent his teenage life advocating for the charity, valiantly supporting the cause and showing courage that was not only beyond his years, but equals that of valiant heroes. The "Stay Kind" initiative calls upon the universal compassion of all Australians to care for one another, to respect one another and to support one another.



It was these core ideas of universal support, taking care of your friends and being kind to others that spoke to RBHS students when choosing an important charity to fundraise for through The Color Run.



We were extremely lucky to have Mrs Kelly visit our school and speak to us about the importance of staying safe, being kind and having conversations around mental health. She shared with us her family's personal journey in order to make the world a better place for young people. We were very moved by the whole experience and by the strength and selflessness of the entire Kelly Family.


We are beginning preparations for our 2018 Colour Run. I will be calling for students to form The Colour Run Committee in the coming weeks. Let's all join together to make a difference!



***Tell Them From Me* student survey:

Dear Parents and Carers

In Term 1 2018, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

As well as schools getting student feedback, the Department of Education, through the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE), has access to data from across NSW and is running a research project to look at state-wide patterns of student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The research is looking at how these things impact on student outcomes, including academic performance. Individual students will **not** be identified in any CESE publications, and all information will be handled in accordance with the relevant privacy legislation. Students' personal information will not be disclosed by the department to any other person or body other than as required by law.

This research will help schools in New South Wales to better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you **do not want your child to take part** in the survey, please complete the form on the other side of this letter and return it to the school office by 22 March, 2018.

This letter is to inform you of the upcoming works scheduled to take place on the "Newmarket" project in over the next few weeks.

The main works being undertaken will involve shoring/piling works, excavation works, hoarding/fencing installation and other site establishment works.

You will have noticed that our perimeter hoarding has already been installed to the boundaries adjacent to the schools, with the remainder of it being completed over the next few weeks.

A glimpse from the past - page 17 Handbook 1966

Try to give your full attention to what you are doing to the exclusion of other things. You may find that, although you are in a quiet room, your mind wanders or you may day-dream. This may be due to overtiredness, thoughts about the television programmes, etc., or to the fact that you are not facing up to your job because you find it difficult. Whatever the cause, face your responsibility and endeavour to develop the habit of concentration.

4. *Develop an Interest.*

The easiest way to concentrate on a subject is to develop an interest in it. Take a vital interest in all your subjects and be alert for anything relating to them—the way you do with your hobbies. If you do this you will find that your difficulties will soon disappear.

5. *Overlearning.*

It is a bad mistake to cease studying as soon as you learn your material. You will very quickly forget, and if you wish to retain your information you must *overlearn* it and frequently revise it. Always carry your study well past the point of barely knowing the work.

6. *Avoid Fatigue.*

Best work is done with a clear, fresh mind. Do not tire yourself physically or mentally before commencing your study period.

7. *Revision.*

You must methodically revise all past work at regular intervals.

8. *Be Active in Study.*

A book open before you can mean nothing. Study means purposeful work and something definite must be done. Useful aids to good study are the making of diagrams, sketches, notes, summaries, working of examples, writing passages from memory, making headings, lists of names and formulae, vocabulary, etc.

9. *Memorising.*

Use the method that suits you best, but understand what you learn.

10. *Discussion.*

Talking things over with another pupil or your parents is helpful. Knowledge becomes more definite and more clearly fixed in the mind when useful discussion has taken place.

Your school work is a challenge to you. Accept that challenge and show your worth by the manner in which you succeed.

EXAMINATIONS

1. Read the paper right through before you attempt to answer any questions.

Take careful notice of all instructions.

2. Mark the questions you have chosen to answer and be sure to include any compulsory questions.

3. Make sure you know the EXACT MEANING of the questions you will answer.

4. It is often wise to begin by doing the questions you can do best. This helps create confidence.

5. It is often helpful to make a short summary of the answer you are going to write.

If you find there is insufficient time to finish an answer, spend the last couple of minutes making a summary of the other points that would have been dealt with.

6. Be reasonably careful of your writing and setting out.
