

Four students from Randwick Boys' High School have been selected to participate in the Australian Junior Beach Volleyball Championships in Bunbury, WA from 26-29 April 2018. We wish them luck!



These are their stories:

My name is Ben Schickinger (Yr 8). I have been selected for the under 15 State Beach Volleyball team. I will be representing the NSW squad. I got in with trials. We are leaving on the 25th of April and playing for 5 days at Bunbury WA, which is 30 minutes south of Perth. I have been playing for one and a half years and got into it, when my coach came to my primary school and encouraged me to come down to Coogee and have a go.

My name is Nima Amini (Yr 9) and I have been selected for the U17 State Beach Volleyball team. I will be heading off to Perth on the 25th of April to represent NSW. I will be returning on the 30th of April. I have been playing beach volleyball for 4 years, and my coach encouraged me to try out for the State team.

My name is Munkh Jargalsaikhan (Yr 9). I have been selected for the U15s NSW Beach Volleyball team to go to Perth to play against our age group in beach volleyball. I have been playing volleyball for 3 years, but I have been playing beach volleyball for only 4 months. We are leaving on the 25th of April for 5 days and versing other states. With my coach Marcos, I train 3-4 times a week at Coogee Beach. When we do NSW State training, we go train at beaches, such as Maroubra, Coogee and mainly Manly.



My name is Joshua Hillard (Yr 10). I have been playing volleyball for a year and a half. I started at Maroubra learning basics. When I had been playing for 2 weeks, I was invited to trial for the Sydney Metro Indoor team to play in a tournament against south, west and north. I was then invited to trial for the State indoor team and trialled and was accepted. In the State team we travelled to Queensland, Coomera, to play AJUV. I was then invited to an AUS camp to get identified and assessed. After Nationals ended, I picked up beach volleyball in the off season of indoor, and got selected for the beach State team in U17 to play in WA.

Marine Biology water training



Marine Biology CPR

On Thursday this week 05/04/18, during Period 3 and 4, the Year 9 Marine Biology class and I took part in a seminar and assessment conducted in the library. The incursion was broken up into two parts, the first session focused on the principals of first aid and the resuscitation process. We were required to listen to Amanda, a very qualified instructor who teaches trainees in first aid and safety in local health services, as well as other schools. She taught the class the entire Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) process and basic first aid, which has helped us gain a better understanding of important practices that might just save a life.

During the second session, we were all put to the test and were required to do both a practical and a theoretical assessment as part of our course requirement. Firstly, we got into pairs and demonstrated to Amanda the 'Danger, Response, Send, Airway, Breathing, CPR, Defibrillation' (DRSABCD) method, performing CPR on a special CPR mannequin. We had to do it correctly, otherwise we failed. It was fun and simple, but once this was all done, we were given a test paper where we needed to score 100% in order to pass. It was difficult for some, but fortunately, everyone passed which was amazing! On Friday the 06/04/18 we completed a practical water safety challenge, at the UNSW Pool; there we were assessed on our swimming ability and water safety knowledge in the field.



For the Year 8 students, who are considering selecting the Marine Biology course next year, the very first topic every Year 9 student must learn is the water safety and first aid component. Although Marine Biology is meant to be fun with many marine field trips and excursions, it is essential that everyone has a clear understanding of safety, the management of a situation and how to avoid any possible dangers. The purpose of these assessments I talked about are to prove that you are trustworthy and able to manage a situation in case something goes wrong and keep safe when going on trips and doing activities. These assessments are run by the Royal Surf Life Saving Club and if you fail to pass all of them, you are still welcome to be in the course, but will miss out on exciting excursions. Overall, I really enjoyed this seminar and assessment and I am glad that we, as a class, passed! Thank you Amanda for coming over and assisting us with our training!



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
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

Anzac Day Report

These are the words of C. E. W. Bean, official Commonwealth War Correspondent at Gallipoli, and author of the "Official History of Australia in the War 1914-18":

"What motives sustained them? At the end of the second or third day of the landing, when half of each battalion had been annihilated, when the dead lay three deep in the rifle pits under the blue sky . . . what was it then that carried each man on?"

It is in the answer to this question that the meaning of Anzac lies, but it is not an easy question to answer. Heroism, patriotism, feeling for "the right side of the fence"—any one, or all of these factors, may be included. Bean answers his own question thus:—

"It lay in the mettle of the men themselves. To be the sort of man who would give way when his mates were trusting to his firmness; to be the sort of man who would fail when the line, the whole force, and the allied cause, required his endurance . . . —that was the prospect which these men could not face."

Since Anzac, times have certainly changed, and so have modes of appearance and behaviour. But whether they believe it or not, all Australians have within them this basic ingredient—an indefinable spirit. This is the reason for a remembrance celebration on the 25th April each year.

This year's occasion saw the entire school assembled in the Hall. To many this may have seemed a waste of time—something to be endured and an excuse to miss a period or two. At one stage in everyone's life this is the prevailing attitude. But maturity develops a sense of question; and the meaning is sought for the celebration. The search for this meaning is the purpose of the celebration.

The Cadet Corps added to this year's remembrance by supplying a catafalque party—the significance of which was explained to the school by Mr. Johnstone. With heads bowed on reversed rifles, the

party under C.U.O. Bebbington added an atmosphere of Anzac, as did the sounding of the "Last Post" and "Reveille" by a member of the school band. Anzac tradition and value may be distant to many of today's pupils and so Mr. Harrison's accounts of bravery during the campaign may have sown the seeds from which grow the values of tradition. Next year another remembrance will be held, and it will probably be much similar to this year's—it is in this way, the preservation of tradition that the standards of the Australian way of life may be passed on to the youth.
