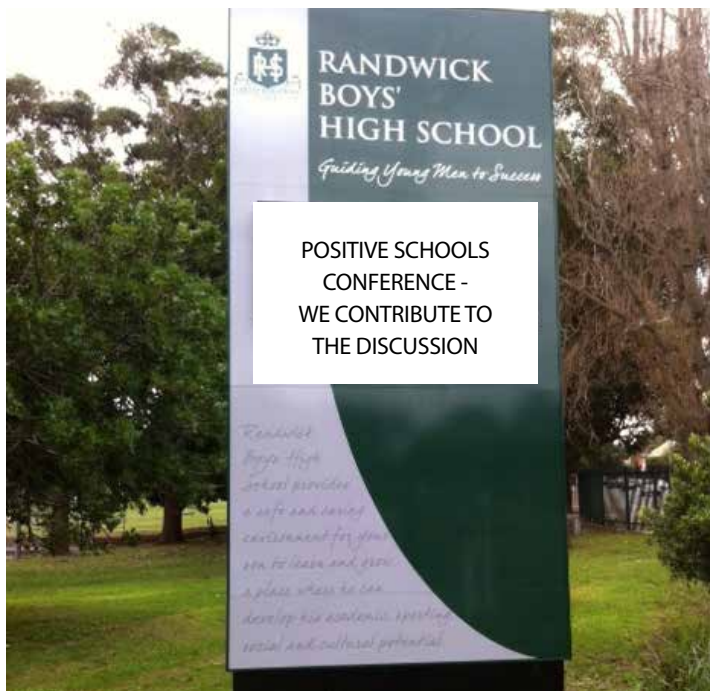

**Arriving at school on time**

The school would like to enlist the support of all parents and carers to ensure that students arrive at school on time before 8.50am each day.

Students are required to be at school at this time in order to attend Roll Call at 8.50am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and assembly on Wednesday. Roll Call involves the roll being marked and important daily information being provided to support students' ability to learn and engage with school. Roll Call is not an optional period – it is a compulsory part of the school day which every student is required to attend.

In terms of preparing students to assume a role in the workplace, punctuality is an important skill, critical to a young person maintaining their employment.

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**Procedures for students transferring to a new High School**

Prior to leaving and transferring to a new high school:

**Parents:**

Notify in writing or by email that the student is leaving RBHS. State the student's name, academic year, date of leaving and name of their new high school.

Pay for elective subjects and school contribution.

Officially clear from our school by signing out from his class and complete a clearance form.

Return all RBHS text books and library books (payment is due if books are not returned).

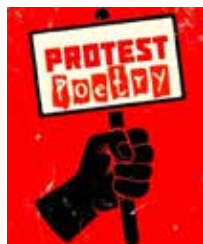
## Year 8 English update

## Computer keyboard skills



Students interested in developing their touch-typing keyboard skills and improving their typing speed using an online software program called Typing Tournament, may see Mr Burke in the Independent Learning Centre to obtain a login & password. Typing Tournament may be accessed at home or school and comprises self-paced modules with drills, exercises, fun games, speed-accuracy tests and progress charts.

In this digital age most high school, TAFE & university students complete assessment tasks using a word processor, while educational institutions are increasingly using online tests and assessments e.g. NAPLAN & VALID.

A student with a two-finger typing speed of 5-7 wpm (words per minute) is severely disadvantaged compared to a student who can manage a smooth 20-30 wpm. The USA educational standard for high school students is 40 wpm.

## Sydney Multicultural Community Services support



My name is Rigzin Yuthok. I am a Youth Worker/Case Worker of the Settlement Support Program (SSP) at Sydney Multicultural Community Services. I am a registered JP and am currently one of the members of the CALD Advisory Committee of Randwick Council.

The program SSP is funded by the Federal Government and is aimed at providing crucial case work support services to newly arrived permanent resident migrants and refugees for their initial five-year period in Australia. The newly arrived migrants and refugees face many difficulties and barriers to education, employment and other areas due to them not knowing English language and Australian system very well.

At Sydney Multicultural Community Services, I have been able to make real differences in the lives of many newly arrived migrants and refugee youth and their parents. One of my youth clients from IRAQ for example has secured a job at Woolworths Eastgardens and is promoted to a supervisor position only a month ago.

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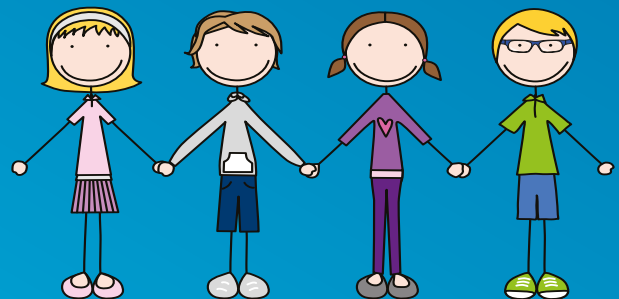


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

## 2018 NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program for Year 10 and Year 11

### Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination

**Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2018**

Dear Parent/Caregivers,

The NSW Ministry of Health and NSW Board of Education offers all Year 10 and Year 11 students one dose of the Meningococcal ACWY vaccination.

The Meningococcal ACWY vaccine protects against the four strains of meningococcal disease.

A *Parent Information pack* and *Consent Form* was distributed to Year 10 and Year 11 students on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> May. The information pack includes an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement.

To consent to the vaccination of your child, parents/caregivers are advised to:

- Read all of the information provided.
- Complete the consent form.
- Return the completed consent form to the school by **Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June**.
- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccinations clinic.

Parents/caregivers who wish to withdraw their consent may do so by writing to the school Principal. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at [www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation](http://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation).

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form (within 1 business day). The Record of Vaccination will be provided by NSW Health, not the school. Parents/caregivers should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

### Meningococcal Vaccination Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2018

On **Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> June**, the South Eastern Sydney Public Health Unit, will be at Randwick Boys' High School providing the Meningococcal vaccination for **Year 10 and 11 students**.

If you would like your son to participate in the NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program, read through the *Parent Information Kit* and complete the consent form.

Your son will need to **return the consent form to the front office by Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June**.

## 2018 Higher School Certificate Examinations Disability Provisions

### Information for Students and Parents

The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) has a program to help students with practical support in their Higher School Certificate examinations. This practical support, known as Disability Provisions, may include a reader, writer, extra time, rest breaks plus others. The use of any provision is not written on the student's results.

Students may need provisions for:

- A permanent condition, such as diabetes or a reading/writing difficulty.
- A temporary condition, such as a broken arm.
- An intermittent condition, such as anxiety or back pain when sitting for long periods.

More than 5000 HSC students apply for provisions each year to show the examiners what they know and can do.

To apply for provisions, the school submits an online application to the NESA. This application includes which provisions the student is requesting and recent evidence. Evidence may include medical reports, reading results, spelling results, writing samples and teacher comments.

Much of the evidence can be collected by the school, but the parents' role is welcome and needed. Parents help by talking with the school, describing the student's needs, and providing the school with medical or other reports.

Applications for provisions need to be submitted by the school to the NESA by end of Term 1. Late applications are accepted for an emergency, such as a broken arm, until the time of the examinations.

Once NESA has made a decision about which provisions are approved or declined, a decision letter is provided to the school. The school will provide the student with a copy of the letter.

If you or the school are not satisfied with the NESA's decision, it is possible for the school to lodge an appeal. Appeals must state why the NESA's decision is unsuitable and must include new evidence to support the appeal.

If you think that you or your son may require support in completing the Higher School Certificate examinations, please discuss the matter with the Year Adviser, School Counsellor, or Learning and Support Teacher.
