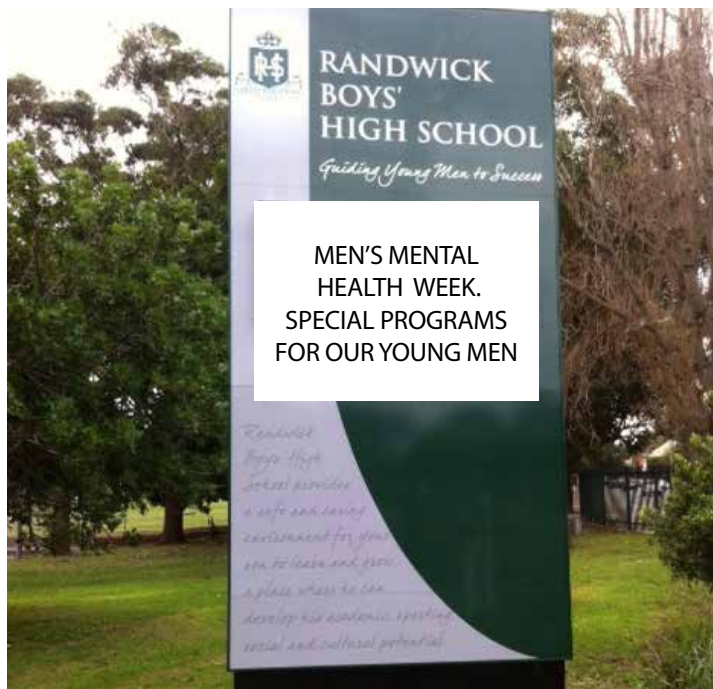

Marine Biology

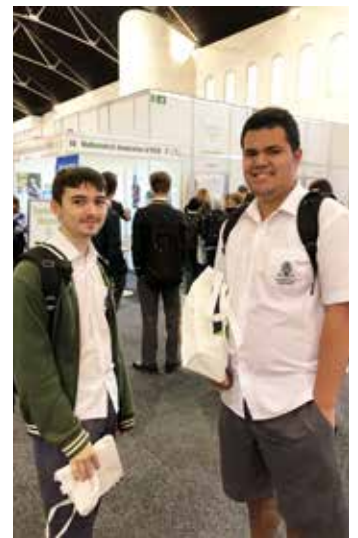
New marine specimens were donated to the Marine Biology classes by Ms Wallis from her personal collection for the studies of Marine Biology.

Year 12 at the HSC and Career Expo

On Friday, 1st June, all RBHS Year 12 students were invited to attend the HSC and Career Expo. The day was a great success with 88 students attending. The Expo is the largest in Sydney and is attended by most public and private high schools in the Sydney Metropolitan Area. It provides a one stop shop for students to explore their post school options and to access HSC resources.



Once again, this year the Expo was held at the Royal Hall of Industries at Moore Park. The Expo has become an annual part of RBHS School to Work program, and helps inform students to make post school choices about all the pathways and tertiary training opportunities available to them. There were well over 140 exhibitors, which included universities, private colleges and TAFE. Students also had the opportunity to attend seminars on HSC subjects, tertiary courses, and career and study advice.



The majority of the students attending stated that it was a very worthwhile and invaluable opportunity. All Year 12 students are now undergoing one-on-one career interviews with the career advisor about their career and pathway planning. I wish them all the best of luck with their upcoming Trial HSC exams.

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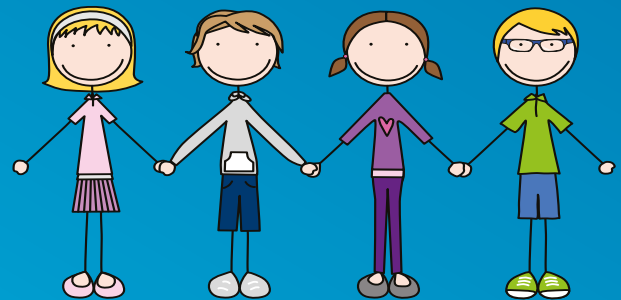

2018 NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program for Year 10 and Year 11

Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination

Friday 22nd June 2018

Dear Parent/Caregivers,

The NSW Ministry of Health and NSW Board of Education offers all Year 10 and Year 11 students one dose of the Meningococcal ACWY vaccination.

The Meningococcal ACWY vaccine protects against the four strains of meningococcal disease.

A *Parent Information pack* and *Consent Form* was distributed to Year 10 and Year 11 students on Thursday 24th May. The information pack includes an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement.

To consent to the vaccination of your child, parents/caregivers are advised to:

- Read all of the information provided.
- Complete the consent form.
- Return the completed consent form to the school by **Friday 15th June**.
- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccinations clinic.

Parents/caregivers who wish to withdraw their consent may do so by writing to the school Principal. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form (within 1 business day). The Record of Vaccination will be provided by NSW Health, not the school. Parents/caregivers should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

Meningococcal Vaccination Friday 22nd June 2018

On **Friday, 22nd June**, the South Eastern Sydney Public Health Unit, will be at Randwick Boys' High School providing the Meningococcal vaccination for **Year 10 and 11 students**.

If you would like your son to participate in the NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program, read through the *Parent Information Kit* and complete the consent form.

Your son will need to **return the consent form to the front office by Friday 15th June**.

Dear Parent

The [Australian Mathematics Competition](#) (AMC) has been held annually since 1978. Your child is invited to enter this internationally recognised competition.

One of the largest annual events on the Australian education calendar, the AMC was the first competition of its kind in Australia and is now one of the largest of its type in the world. More than 30 countries participate each year.

The competition aims to be accessible to all students from Years 3 to 12, not just the mathematically gifted. There is an emphasis on problem solving, a valuable life skill, and the questions are designed to be fun for the student. The AMC consists of five separate papers, each with 30 questions in the Middle Primary (Years 3 and 4), Upper Primary (Years 5 and 6), Junior (Years 7 and 8), Intermediate (Years 9 and 10) and Senior (Years 11 and 12) divisions. Time allowed is 60 minutes for the primary papers and 75 minutes for the secondary papers.

Over 1,000 students share the prizes and around 50% of participants qualify to receive a Certificate of High Distinction, Distinction or Credit. All other entrants in the competition receive a Certificate of Participation or a Proficiency Certificate. All students are also provided with a detailed report showing how they performed on each problem with wider statistical rankings.

To enter the Australian Mathematics competition you need to pay exactly \$6 to the front office before Thursday the 14th of June.

Dear Sir/Madam,

This letter is to inform you of the works that are going to be completed over the coming weeks.

In the Northern end of the site, we are approaching completion of the rock-breaking activities and have already begun structural works on the basement slabs. Upon completion of rock breaking, activities to note will be general carpentry works, and concrete pouring works. Note that we are also preparing to erect the crane in that Northern section of site.

In the Southern end of the site, we are approaching completion of the shoring works, with the bulk of the sheet piling (being the noisiest of those works) having already been completed. We will now be continuing with excavating the sand and envisage commencing the foundation piling works (the drilling rig) shortly.

Towards the South Western zone of the site (West of Young St), we are continuing to load out (remove from site) the stockpiles currently located in the area. It is also relevant to note that we are expecting to commence the infrastructure works in that area over the coming weeks. These works will include construction of new roads, and installation of in-ground services such as sewer and water infrastructure, stormwater drainage, and electrical infrastructure. Note that these works are expected to be completed in the 3rd quarter of 2019. We will be providing notices with specific updates in relation to traffic changes regularly.

Notification of out of hours work – Randwick

In planning for Tomorrow's Sydney we are building a new light rail line to provide modern, reliable and sustainable public transport that will transform services from Circular Quay and the CBD, to Kingsford and Randwick via Surry Hills, Moore Park and Kensington.

Standard work hours are Monday to Friday 6am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 5pm. This notification is for approved work that falls outside the standard working hours. This work will be carried out on the below dates and times to minimise disruption to traffic and to maintain the safety of construction work, residents, businesses and the general public.

Details of work activities

Work will take place from **Friday 1 June to Sunday 1 July 2018**. Work will be carried out from **6pm to 6am Sunday to Thursday nights**, and **from 8am to 5pm on Sundays**. Work will only occur on Friday and Saturday nights when required. Affected stakeholders will be notified.

Work will be carried out at the following locations:

- High Street, between Avoca Street and Wansey Road
- Work may also occur on nearby streets and cross streets up to a distance of 50m from High Street. Nearby streets include Botany Street, Eurimbla Avenue, Hospital Road, Blenheim Street, Clara Street, Wansey Road, Belmore Road and Avoca Street. Work may also occur up to 200m west on High Street from Wansey Road.

Activities involve geotechnical investigations (surveying and potholing), utility investigation, protection and relocation, heritage work, vegetation works (including tree protection, trimming, mulching, relocation and removal of trees and shrubs), movement of ground fill, excavation and ground stabilisation work, trenching, concrete pours, pavement work (includes asphaltting, footpath and pedestrian crossing relocation, line marking and removal, median strip removal, kerb and gutter work), road reinstatement, track construction, storm water installation, pile foundation installation, track work (includes rail preparation work, concrete pouring, rail delivery, rail/track installation, surveying, welding, saw cutting and surface finishing), setting up traffic signals and signage.

Equipment and vehicles used for this work may include survey equipment, concrete trucks and pumps, concrete vibrators, flood lights, vacuum excavation trucks, coring and drilling machines, excavators, cranes, saw cutters, road grinders, tipper trucks, elevated work platforms, winches, generators, hand tools, water carts, semi-trailers, chainsaws, street sweepers, spray seal trucks, lighting towers, traffic signage, barriers and traffic control vehicles.

You may experience some noise and vibration during this work, high noise activities such as saw cutting and jackhammering will be completed by midnight. To minimise impacts, work will not take place for more than two consecutive nights in the same location unless otherwise notified. Mitigation measures including noise blankets will be used. Vehicles will be switched off when not in use to minimise noise.

Traffic and pedestrian changes

Some street parking may be temporarily removed at night.

There may be some general traffic lane, footpath closures and minor detours. Some minor traffic delays may be experienced. Where required, traffic control will be in place to direct cyclists, motorists and pedestrians safely around the operations. Access for emergency services and local residents will be maintained at all times.

Construction Update – Continuous weekend work

In planning for Tomorrow's Sydney we are building a new light rail line to provide modern, reliable and sustainable public transport that will transform services from Circular Quay and the CBD, to Kingsford and Randwick via Surry Hills, Moore Park and Kensington.

Weekend work at the intersection of High Street and Avoca Street from 9pm Friday 15 June to 5am Monday 18 June 2018

Continuous weekend work will be undertaken at the intersection of High Street and Avoca Street from 9pm Friday 15 June until 5am Monday 18 June 2018.

There will be restricted vehicle access for eastbound traffic on High Street from the intersection at Clara Street from 9pm Friday 15 June until 5am Saturday 16 June; and then 8pm Saturday 16 June, until 5am Monday 18 June 2018. General traffic wanting to access the Avoca Street intersection will be detoured via Arthur Street and/or Short Street. Two northbound lanes will be maintained from the southern end of Avoca Street.

Local access will be maintained on High Street between Clara and Avoca Streets for residents, businesses and emergency services. Access will also be provided for waste collection, delivery vehicles and vehicles requiring access to the Prince of Wales Hospital. Please follow the directions of traffic control located nearby the works. Pedestrian access on High Street between Clara and Avoca Streets will be maintained at all times.

Activities will involve excavation, structural work, conduits installation, road pavement work, barrier installation, traffic signal work, changes to signage and line marking, saw cutting, backfilling, asphalt reinstatement, lane closure and traffic changes.

Equipment and vehicles for this work may include radar detection, survey and monitoring equipment, flood lights, vacuum excavators, cranes, saw cutters, compaction equipment, asphalt milling plant, welding equipment, jackhammers, utes, water carts, traffic signage, barriers and traffic control vehicles.
