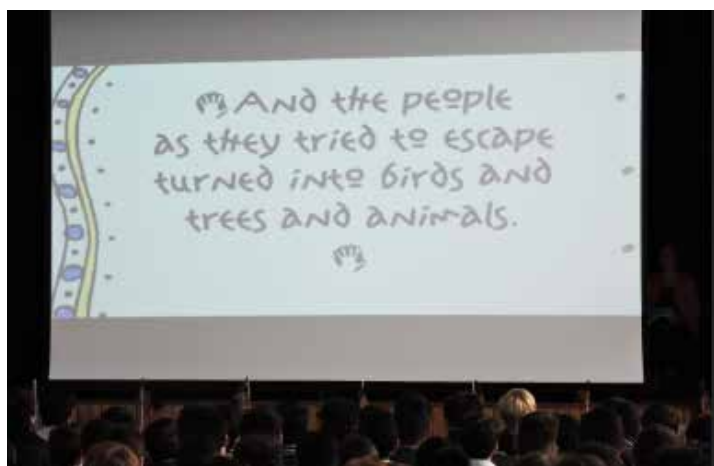

From the Principal

Parent/Teacher evening

Following the presentation, Year 10 parents and students will then move to the school hall where staff and faculties will explain individual elective requirements for Year 11 and 12, in more detail.

Our Careers Advisor, Mr Dimopoulos, will also be in attendance to discuss University courses and options. Students and parents are encouraged to attend so that you can make INFORMED decisions regarding subjects and courses.

Randwick Boys' High School – Future

There has been a great deal in the media and in the community concerning the future of Randwick Boys' High School. At this stage, there are no concrete plans to make Randwick Boys' High School a Co-Ed school. There has been discussion concerning this proposal; however, no decision has been made. The final decision will be made by the Minister for Education and the current Government. I realise certain media outlets are reporting that a decision has been made; however, these reports are premature. Consultation continues with various groups in the community and, I am sure, when the time comes, parents, students and staff will have an avenue to express their views. In the meantime, it is 'Teaching and Learning' as usual in our dynamic, inclusive, wonderful school.

Early Leavers from School

From time to time, students are required by their parents to leave school early. On all occasions, we require written authorisation from parents to be able to approve this. This is especially important on sport afternoons (Wednesdays) when large numbers of students are off site at different venues.

Students should bring their parental letters to the Deputy to get signed. Letters are then taken to the rolls office where the early leave is logged on our system.

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Procedures for students transferring to a new High School

Prior to leaving and transferring to a new high school:

Parents:

Notify in writing or by email that the student is leaving RBHS. State the student's name, academic year, date of leaving and name of their new high school.

Pay for elective subjects and school contribution.

Student:

Officially clear from our school by signing out from his class and complete a clearance form.

Return all RBHS text books and library books (payment is due if books are not returned).

English Authentic Assessment

Over the last two days, all Year 9 and 10 students have been presenting a portfolio of their work from English to panels of teachers and members of the community.

The process gives students a chance to share their work and give feedback to the faculty about programs, assessment and teaching practice. It has been invaluable for encouraging the students' skills in organisation, self-direction, revision and real-world skills such as presentation and articulation in interviews.



Director Mark Barraket was also in attendance and commented on the significant value of feedback and collaboration for both students and teachers. 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WordFlyers Literacy Program



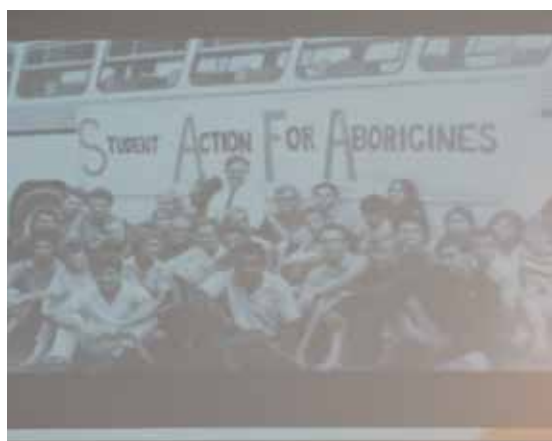
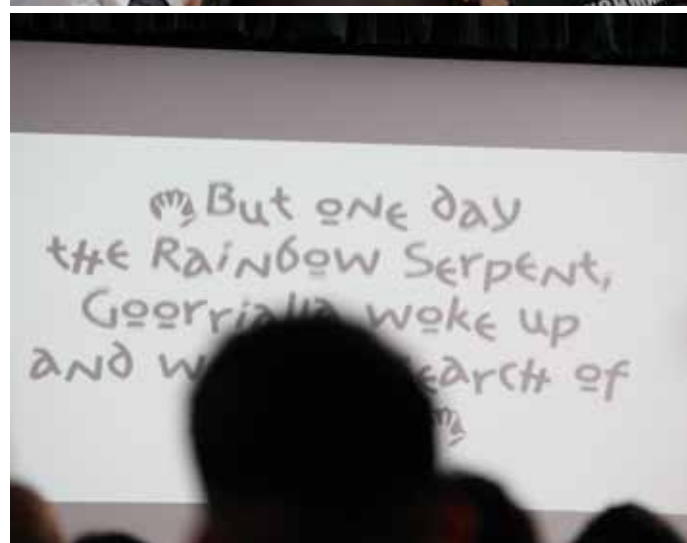
As an initiative to help improve students' literacy, all students in Years 7 and 8 will be given an account for WordFlyers, a comprehensive online literacy program for students in Years 7–10. The program aims to improve grammar, reading, comprehension, punctuation, vocabulary and writing. The program provides differentiated activities that allow students to work at their ability, with a review level designed to bring struggling students up to standard. Students engage with and analyse short, high interest, real-world texts, with activities and rewards that reinforce learning. The lessons in WordFlyers build a strong platform for student success in tests such as NAPLAN.

In the next few weeks, students will be modelled how to use the site by their English teachers. One English lesson a fortnight will be dedicated to literacy; however, students are welcome to use the site at home for homework, consolidation of skills or FUN!

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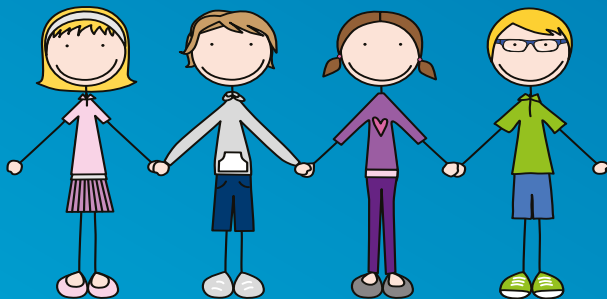

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2018/19 Summer Sports Selections

Dear parents/guardian,

Students in years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 will be required to select a Sport for the 2018/19 Summer Season. The Summer season begins on Wednesday 8th August, in term 3.

Students are required to select a first preference sport and a reserve sport. Below is a list of Summer Sports on offer. Grade sports trials will be held in the first three weeks of the season. Students who do not make the grade team will be placed in their reserve sport, provided there is space in the sport.

Please note:

- If you select a Grade Sport you must select the age group that you will be in 2019. For example, if you are currently 13 and turn 14 in 2019, select the 14s age group.
- ALL Grade Sports incur a \$60 fee. This fee goes towards the cost of bus hire, venue hire, referees/umpires, uniform and equipment and must be paid once you have been selected in the grade sport.
- Some Recreational and House Sports require an entry fee.
- Weights/Fitness – due to age restrictions Weight/Fitness is offered to students in year 10 and 11 only.
- Year 11 students will continue to attend their Summer Sport throughout term 4.

Sport selection is to be completed online through Edval WebChoices. **Edval Webchoices will be available from Tuesday 24th July and close at 3:15pm on Friday 3rd August 2018.** All students have been issued with an individual web code and instructions on how to select their Summer Sport. Sports is compulsory, all students must select a sport.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Current Year 10 students who did not achieve Band 8 or above in the 2017 NAPLAN reading, writing or numeracy test, will need to take the corresponding online test to achieve the HSC minimum standard.

Current Year 10 students who achieved a Band 8 or above in a 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing or numeracy test are recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that particular area and will not need to sit the corresponding online test.

The tests will involve:

- Minimum Standard Reading Test — 45 multiple choice questions
- Minimum Standard Numeracy Test — 45 multiple choice questions
- Minimum Standard Writing Test — one question based on a visual or text prompt with up to a 500 word-response

The Minimum Standard tests will be conducted for year 10 students at Randwick Boys' High School on the following dates:

- Thursday 16 August — Writing Test
- Friday 17 August — Reading and Numeracy Test

(Students will be notified in Week 2 if they are required to take the test).

IMPROVING LITERACY AND NUMERACY

ADVICE FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 10 STUDENTS

February 2018 update

A minimum standard of literacy and numeracy is required for your child to receive their Higher School Certificate (HSC).

Meeting the HSC minimum standard will mean that your child has the literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for success in learning and life after school.



THE ONLINE TESTS

Most students will show they have met the HSC minimum standard by passing minimum standard online tests. Students master basic skills at different stages so there are **multiple opportunities** available to pass the tests, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12.



There are three 45-minute online tests:

- ✓ a multiple choice **reading** test
- ✓ a multiple choice **numeracy** test
- ✓ a short **writing** test based on a choice between a visual or written prompt

2017 NAPLAN TESTS

If your child achieved Band 8s or above in one or more of the 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN tests they are recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that area/s and will not need to sit the corresponding online test/s.

TEST DATES

Students will have two opportunities a year, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12, to pass each online test.



The online test dates (school days only) for 2018 are:

- Term 1: 19 February to 23 March 2018
- Term 2: 21 May to 22 June 2018
- Term 3: 13 August to 14 September 2018
- Term 4: 5 November to 7 December 2018

WHAT TO EXPECT?

To help your child understand what to expect in the online tests, they are encouraged to visit educationstandards.nesa.nsw.edu.au/HSCminimumstandard to:

- ✓ try demonstration questions to get a feel for the test format
- ✓ view sample test questions and answers online

Your child's school may also organise short practice tests.



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Some students with disabilities will be eligible for extra provisions for the minimum standard online tests, or an exemption from the HSC minimum standard requirement.

Students are encouraged to talk to their teachers to determine whether they are eligible for provisions. A Disability Provisions, Exemptions and Appeals policy, which contains further information, is available on the NESA website.

Randwick Boys High School upgrade

Project update

July 2018

The NSW Government's 2018/19 Budget includes \$6 billion over four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools.

Investing in our schools

This year's budget includes an additional \$160 million spend as part of the record \$747 million maintenance investment announced last year. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Randwick Boys High School project

The NSW Government will provide an additional \$60 million over four years for planning new and upgraded schools. This year an upgrade to Randwick Boys High School and Randwick Girls High School will be prioritised for planning.

What's next?

Early internal investigations and analysis is now underway to:

- identify what school infrastructure solution is needed and why
- assess how much it will cost
- review funding options to deliver a proposed solution.

How can I get involved?

We are committed to working together with our school communities and other stakeholders to deliver the best possible learning facilities for students. This project is at the very early stages of planning and we will keep you informed as soon as we know more.

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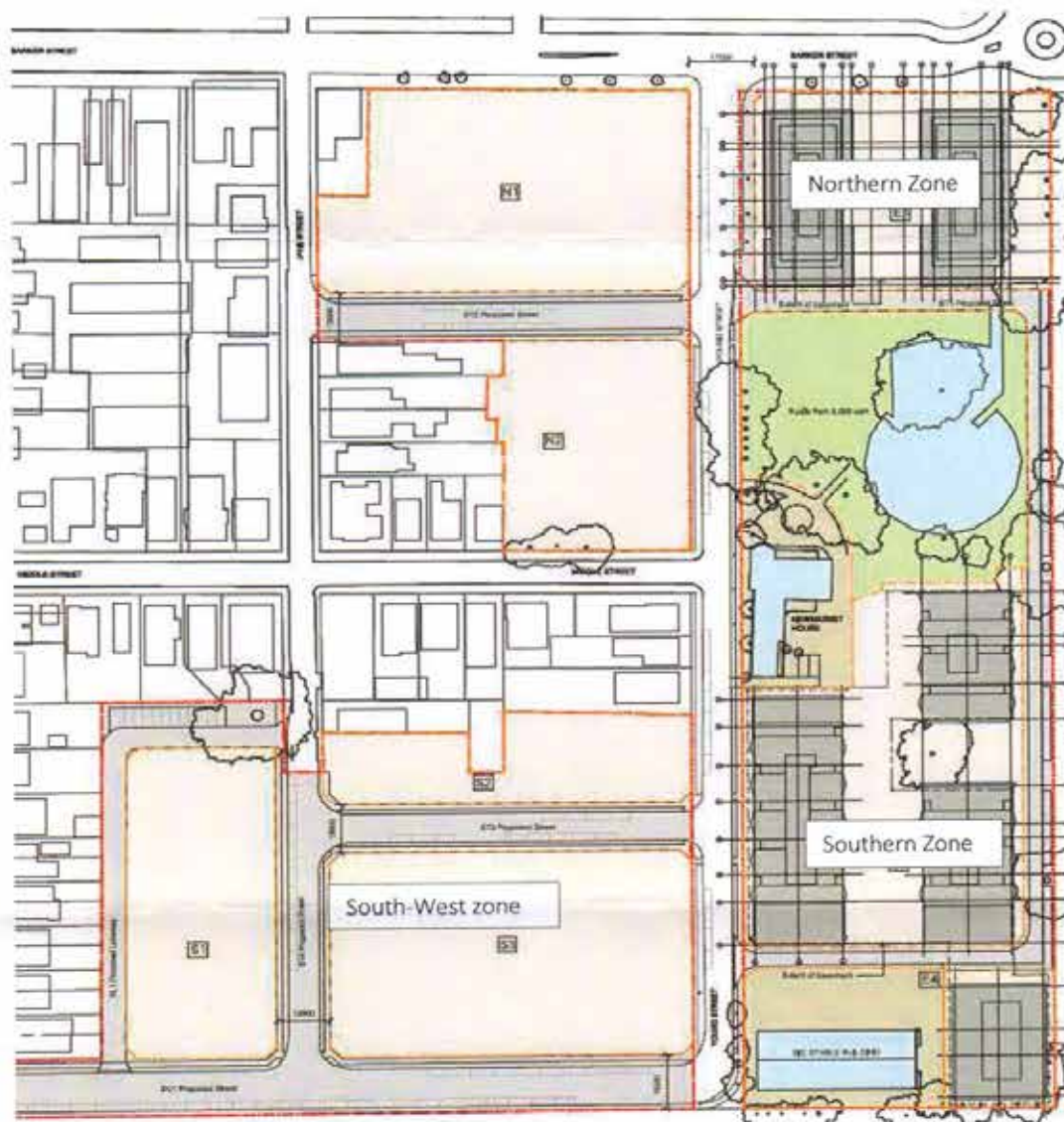
