












From the Principal

An incident occurred this morning near Maroubra Junction Public School where a primary school-aged student, not from our school, was approached by two men in a motor vehicle.

The student, who was not harmed, avoided the men and reported the matter to a teacher when arriving at his school. Police were then informed.

Although this incident did not involve Maroubra Junction Public School or one of its students, our teachers will remind their classes about the 'Stranger Danger' messages which are regularly provided. We would like your support in reinforcing this message at home.

Randwick Girls' - 'Speak Out'

We were honoured to receive an invitation to participate in Randwick Girls' High School's 'Speak Out' assembly on Wednesday, 20 November. 'Speak Out' is a movement aiming to raise awareness and take action on the scourge of violence against women, and replaces the White Ribbon Day campaign of recent years.

Brendan Bretlen, Hayden Wong Wing Kee, Jack Doyle, Nicholas Franciskus, Jasper Lloyd, Rian Bairle, Ryan Kiss and Sebastien Geoffroy represented our school. Their presence in support of our sister school was acknowledged by local MP Matt Thistlethwaite in his address on the prevalence of domestic violence in our community. Belinda Casseldon, a board member of Deli Women and Children Service spoke movingly on the problem of abusive relationships, and gave the young women in the audience many important perspectives on their rights. Latoya Brown, a Dharawal woman, taught us about the central role of women in Indigenous culture.





I was proud to have been accompanied by our school delegation who discussed with me their responses to the powerful speeches afterwards. It was wonderful for the young women of RGHS to have seen our young men in solidarity with them on this urgent issue.

The tradition of RBHS's involvement in campaigning against sexual violence and relationship abuse will continue with other activities over the next few days. As with many things that occur in schools, family discussions on representations and attitudes towards women will support our work as teachers.
