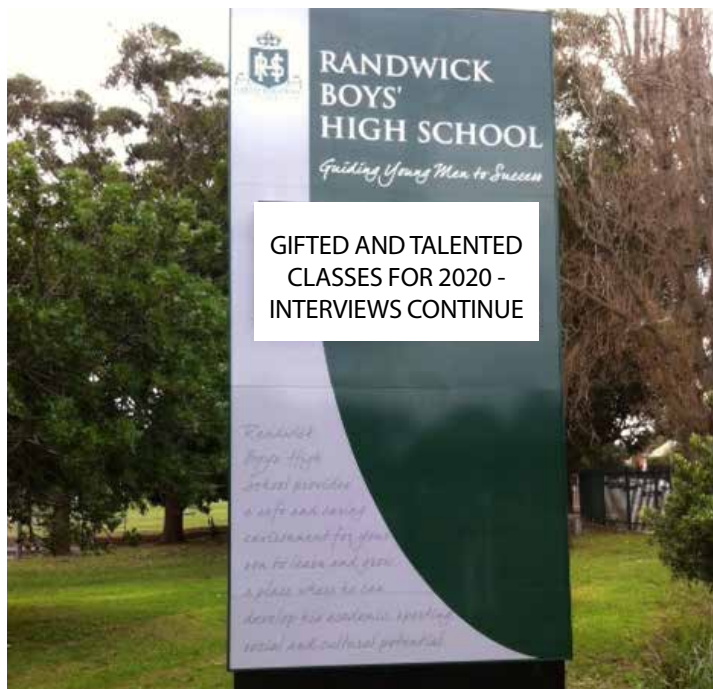

## From the Principal

### Subject selection evening for current Year 8 and 10 – Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> August



Our annual subject selection evening is for students who are choosing elective subjects. Current Year 8 students have, for the first time, control over some of the subjects they wish to study. In the next 2 weeks, Year 8 will be asked to choose their **ELECTIVES** (two) for study over the next two years. To

ensure that students make **INFORMED** decisions, we have organised a Parent and Student information evening on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> August at 6pm. Year 8 parents and students will need to be in the Library by 5.50pm as we begin promptly at 6pm. The evening is in two parts. First, parents and students hear from me and are shown what is expected in terms of electives, subject requirements, fees etc. Then, students and parents move to the hall where every elective and mandatory subject is represented and available to discuss course requirements etc.

Current Year 10 students have the same opportunity. Parents and students of Year 10 are required to be in the Library at 6.50pm as we begin promptly at 7pm. Again, parents and students hear from me and then move to the hall to discuss courses and requirements with all subjects represented.



It is **VITAL** that all Year 8 and 10 students and parents attend so we can assist them to make **INFORMED** decisions regarding their future patterns of study.

### Debating vs Sydney Girls' HS



It was wonderful to see our Year 7 students engaged in a debate against Sydney Girls' HS this week. Our students did a tremendous job and made some outstanding points whilst rebuffing points made by the opposition. In a first for Randwick Boys' debating, the adjudicator was unable to attend at the last minute, so the debate was filmed and sent away for analysis before a winning team will be announced. We wish the team well and thank Ms Check, Ms Beaumont and Ms Payne for their coordination of Debating at our school.

### Parent/Teacher evening – Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> August

It was fantastic to see so many parents attend our Year 8, 9 and 10 Parent/teacher interviews earlier this week. Most were extremely impressed with the progress of their son. It is vital that students also read and analyse their report, especially the comments from their teachers, as there is advice on what needs to be addressed in terms of improvements. We look forward to improvements from all students during Semester Two.



### Year 11 Prefect speeches

This week, 23 brave Year 11 students elected to be considered for 12 Perfect positions for 2020. Students presented speeches to the Year 11 cohort. Speeches were also filmed and uploaded so that all staff are able to view them as well. Voting is currently taking place and successful candidates will be announced shortly. Then, the 12 prefects, as well as staff, will elect a School Captain and Vice-Captain following nominations and another speech. It is brilliant to see so many leaders electing to be considered for the important position of Prefect. It will be a tough decision to let only 12 know that they have been elected! A special thanks to Ms Austen for coordinating the nominations and elections of Prefects as well as the Student Representative Council, made up of students from ALL year groups.

## HSC Minimum Standard Online Tests - Year 10, 2019

Every student in NSW is being supported to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the HSC from 2020.

Students need to meet the HSC minimum standard to receive the HSC. To show they meet the standard students need to achieve Level 3 or 4 in the online reading, writing and numeracy test.



From 2020, only students who meet the HSC minimum standard will receive a Higher School Certificate testamur. Students do not need to meet the HSC minimum standard to:

- study HSC courses
- sit HSC exams
- receive HSC assessment and exam results
- receive an ATAR
- receive a Record of School Achievement.

Students have two opportunities a year in Years 10, 11 or 12 to pass any tests needed. They will also be able to take them for a few years after they leave school.

The tests have been scheduled to take place for Year 10 students at Randwick Boys' High School on Thursday 29 and Friday 30 August. They will sit practice tests on Thursday 22 and Friday 23 August.

# HSC MINIMUM STANDARD

You need **reading, writing and maths skills for everyday life** after school. This is why you are required to demonstrate a **minimum standard of literacy and numeracy** to receive the Higher School Certificate (HSC) from 2020.



To make sure you have the basics right, and show you meet the minimum standard, you need to pass short online tests of everyday reading, writing and maths skills.

- ✓ The tests will be available to take at school up to twice a year in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12, and even after the HSC.
- ✓ Sample questions and answers are available online, as well as practice tests and advice from students who have completed the tests.
- ✓ Your school will help you decide when you are ready to take each test.
- ✓ You do not need to sit the reading, writing or numeracy online test(s) if you achieved Band 8 or above in the respective 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN test(s).

## STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Some students with disabilities will be eligible for extra provisions for the online tests, or an exemption. Talk to your teachers to determine whether you are eligible for provisions. A Disability Provisions, Exemptions and Appeals policy is available on the NESA website.

This is an opportunity for you and your son to be informed of the course requirements for years 9 and 10, and years 11 and 12.

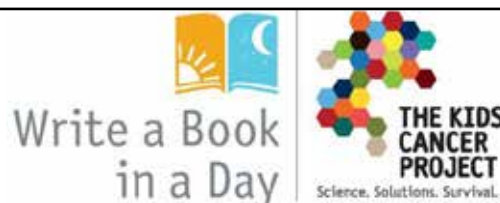
