Randwick Boys' High School staff have been informed by the Department of Education that Randwick Boys' High School will remain a boys' only school and will not transition to being a coeducational secondary school. Details regarding the decision can be accessed in this newsletter as well as via a link outlined elsewhere in this newsletter. Parents and Guardians were sent an email today with details regarding the decision and information concerning the consultation website and Frequently asked Questions. Students will be informed ASAP.

Dear Lance

You and your staff have now received advice from the Department of Education that Randwick Boys High School will remain a boys only school and will not transition to being a co-educational secondary school.

This decision follows an extensive consultation process (undertaken by an external agency) during which the views of 40 school communities were heard and more than 2,200 online survey responses were received. The consultation comprised three parts: an online survey, commentary and submissions sent to a dedicated email address, and face-to-face meetings. As part of the process there was also consultation with teachers and representative groups such as the NSW Secondary Principals Council and the NSW Teachers Federation as well as with parents.

While the results of the online survey supported the proposal to transition Randwick Boys High School to a co-educational secondary school, the views of families, students and staff who would be most directly impacted by such a decision did not provide clear support for a change.

The community spoke very strongly about the need to retain the choice of a single-sex public secondary school for boys in the Eastern Suburbs, especially given that Randwick Boys High School is the only comprehensive public boys school in the area. The issue of educational choice was also raised by representative groups, noting that the Inner Sydney High School and Alexandria Park Community School will provide further options for co-educational secondary schooling.

The Department heard strong views that parents want more real choice in secondary education in Sydney's Eastern Suburbs. The Department will develop a strategy to support secondary public education across all the public secondary schools in the Eastern Suburbs.

The Department appreciates the cooperation of you and your school community during the consultation process.

HSC Minimum Standard Online Tests -Year 10, 2019

Every student in NSW is being supported to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the HSC from 2020.

Students need to meet the HSC minimum standard to receive the HSC. To show they meet the standard students need to achieve Level 3 or 4 in the online reading, writing and numeracy test.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARD

From 2020, only students who meet the HSC minimum standard will receive a Higher School Certificate testamur. Students do not need to meet the HSC minimum standard to:

study HSC courses

sit HSC exams

receive HSC assessment and exam results

receive an ATAR

receive a Record of School Achievement.

Students have two opportunities a year in Years 10, 11 or 12 to pass any tests needed. They will also be able to take them for a few years after they leave school.

The tests have been scheduled to take place for Year 10 students at Randwick Boys' High School on Thursday 29 and Friday 30 August. They will sit practice tests on Thursday 22 and Friday 23 August.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARD

You need reading, writing and maths skills for everyday life after school. This why you are required to demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the Higher School Certificate (HSC) from 2020.



To make sure you have the basics right, and show you meet the minimum standard, you need to pass short online tests of everyday reading, writing and maths skills.



The tests will be available to take at school up to twice a year in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12, and even after the HSC.



Sample questions and answers are available online, as well as practice tests and advice from students who have completed the tests.



Your school will help you decide when you are ready to take each test.

You do not need to sit the reading, writing or numeracy online test(s) if you achieved Band 8 or above in the respective 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN test(s).

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Some students with disabilities will be eligible for extra provisions for the online tests, or an exemption. Talk to your teachers to determine whether you are eligible for provisions. A Disability Provisions, Exemptions and Appeals policy is available on the NESA website.

Time Management - Using a Term Planner

The School's Assessment Team has designed four templates for students to use as a term planner. Each template is based on a school term. A term planner is a record of important dates for the term related to your study. It allows you to keep track of what pieces of assessment are due and how much they are worth at one glance. It can help you to manage your time more effectively by allowing you to identify your peak study load times so that you can make sure that you have plenty of time to get all your assignments done. These four templates are available on the school's website for you to download and use.

Follow these steps to use your term planner effectively:

1. At the start of each year, you will be given a course outline for each of your subjects which should detail what pieces of assessment are required for that subject, how much they are worth and when they are due. Put this information into your term planner. Write the exact week or dates that they are due. For example:

- 2. From this overview you can see when your busy times are going to be. Use this information to determine when you will begin work on a piece of assessment. For example, with five pieces of assessment due within a three-week period, it would be sensible for this student to plan to begin work on some, or all, of these pieces of assessment several weeks before they are due. These start dates can be marked on the planner.
- 3. Knowing how much each piece of assessment is worth will help you to determine how much time to spend on it. For example, it doesn't make sense to allocate three weeks to prepare an assignment worth 20% and only one week to prepare a major project worth 60%.
- 4. List other important dates and activities on your term planner. If there are important events coming up (eg. a wedding, family visit) put these into your planner. This helps help you identify if you have assessment due around that same time so you to plan to start it earlier.
- 5. Once you have completed your term planner put it somewhere where you can see it easily (eg. above your regular study area, taped to the front of your main study folder). It's of no use to you if it's hidden under a pile of papers or tucked into the back of a diary.
- 6. Refer to it frequently so that no piece of assessment just 'sneaks up' on you. Also, you may need to update your term planer occasionally as some assessment dates may change. Check with your teacher often.

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Consultation process and outcome

What was the purpose of the consultation?

The purpose of the consultation was to gather feedback on the proposal to turn Randwick Boys High School into a co-educational secondary school.

How was feedback gathered when considering the proposal to turn Randwick Boys High School into a coeducational school?

The consultation comprised three parts: an online-survey, commentary and submissions sent to a dedicated email address, and face-to-face meetings.

Over two months, members of the community were able to complete an online survey, as well as provide more detailed comments via a dedicated email address. More than 2,200 people responded to the survey, and almost 100 emails were received.

In addition, 30 hours of face-to-face information booths were held across Sydney's Eastern Suburbs and 40 schools received school-gate visits to promote the survey and consultation in general.

Senior NSW Department of Education officers also met with representatives of key stakeholder groups, including the NSW Secondary Principals Council, teachers at Randwick Boys High School and Randwick Girls High School and representatives of the NSW Teachers Federation.

What was the outcome of the consultation on Randwick Boys High School?

After consultation with 40 school communities and receiving more than 2,200 online survey responses, the NSW Department of Education determined that Randwick Boys High School would remain a single-sex boys' school.

The department heard strong views that parents want more real choice in secondary education in Sydney's Eastern Suburbs. The department will develop a strategy to support secondary public education across all the public secondary schools in the eastern suburbs.





What was the level of support for the proposal?

Approximately 66 per cent of the online survey respondents supported the proposal to make Randwick Boys High School a co-educational school.

However, 70 percent of female students who responded said they would not be interested in attending Randwick Boys High School if it was co-educational, and just over 50 percent of male students were either neutral or not interested in attending Randwick Boys High School if it became co-educational.

Representative groups such as the NSW Teacher's Federation and the NSW Secondary Principals Council highlighted important issues, which were considered in the decision to keep Randwick Boys High School a boys-only secondary school.

Given the levels of support, why has this decision been made?

While 66 per cent of the online survey respondents supported the proposal to turn Randwick Boys High School to a co-educational secondary school, the views of families and students most directly affected by the decision did not provide clear support for a change. These views needed to be carefully weighed against overall sentiment.

The department listened to the policy issues highlighted by representative groups, particularly the issue of preserving choice for public secondary education in Sydney's Eastern Suburbs.

What does the decision mean for Randwick Boys High School?

Randwick Boys High School will remain a single-sex boys only secondary school.

Will there be any changes to Randwick Girls High School?

Making a change to Randwick Girls High School was not part of the consultation. Randwick Girls High School will continue as a single-sex girls only secondary school.
