From the Principal

Parent Teacher evening – Tuesday Year 7, 8 and 9

The second Parent/Teacher evening, for Year 7, 8 and 9 was held on Tuesday 8th September from 3.30 – 6 via Zoom. Most of the feedback we have received from parents/guardians has been very positive. There were some issues with accessing the scheduled meeting for a small number of parents. As this was the first year that we have used Zoom as a means of informing parents of progress etc, should we need to do so again, some of the processes will be streamlined.



Year 12 update

As you have probably heard in the media, schools are being asked to prepare for the upcoming Higher School Certificate Exams as per usual.

We have also been asked to develop a contingency plan SHOULD Covid-19 affect the regular examination process. This week, I have met with the Randwick Boys' High School Presiding Officer, who coordinates the examinations and organises the invigilators etc. Together, we have developed a plan should the process be affected by Covid-19.

Jo Sayers, Principal of Rainbow Street Public School has kindly agreed to host our examinations should our school hall become

unusable. I would like to thank Jo and the Rainbow Street Public School staff and community for agreeing to be a part of our contingency plan.

We have 79 Year 12 students. Announcements included the fact we can only have 75 students in one exam hall at one time. Due to the fact that some of our students access special provisions for their exams, I can assure our community that there will be 75 or fewer in each exam. During the HSC period, the hall will not be accessed by any other groups.

We have also organised extra invigilators, who supervise the examinations. We have been informed that students will be provided information in the HSC COVID-19 Toolkit, which the Department of Education is hoping to issue shortly.

Basic information still remains for the HSC period, as it does every school day:

If a student is not well, especially if they have flu like symptoms, do not attend school, even if they have a HSC examination. A medical certificate will need to be provided. Students in this situation will also be asked to arrange to have a COVID-19 test. If arranging a COVID-19 test, ensure you state you are a HSC student, ask that your referral be marked 'urgent – HSC', self-isolate until a negative result, call the contact number provided by the clinic if results are not received within 36 hours.

Hygiene supplies will be available at all exam venues (Sanitiser and wipes)

Students need arrive no more than 20 minutes prior to a HSC exam and report directly to the exam room for sign in.

Students should not mingle in large groups prior to, or after an exam.

Students with a clinical history/known illness that may appear like COVID-19 symptoms, should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide written assurance – eg Symptom the student presents on a normal basis.

Students should be washing hands regularly, using sanitizer, maintaining protocols re sneezing, coughing, avoid shaking hands and hugging.

These requirements have been sent to schools by the Department of Education, in consultation with the Department of Health.
