Cricket Report – Day 1 of grand final

04 March

RBHS's 2nd grade cricketers are well placed in their defence of the North West Metropolitan Zone trophy, after posting 9/154 from 30 overs against a strong Homebush XI. Following the dismissal of Vaishu Ausula Shyam in the third over, a 59 run partnership by Joel Fortmann and Oliver Sissian-Turnbull consolidated the innings.

Facing express pace from Homebush's Zuben, Fortmann and Sissian-Turnbull exhibited great patience and defensive skill in establishing themselves at the crease. With the dismissal of Fortmann

for a watchful 39, Sissian-Turnbull took the momentum away from Homebush. Cricket fans will be familiar with the dictum of 'punishing the loose ball'. This means to wait for a less than perfect delivery from the bowler to attack, while defending against better balls. Sissian-Turnbull did this masterfully in the second session. In compiling a run-a-ball 83, he smote 4 sixes and 10 fours with his excellent timing.



When dismissed in the 27th over, Sissian-Turnbull had placed Randwick in a commanding position. But better bowling in the final three overs from Homebush meant that Randwick could not quite capitalise further. Clever strokeplay and quick running from Nick Read helped to rotate the strike in the death.

Homebush will be chasing an imposing total next Wednesday, and will have to show similar caution themselves to endure RBHS's formidable bowling attack led by Savarpreet Singh. The match will resume March 10.








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Tournament of Minds 2021



Dear Parents and Students,

Tournament of Minds (TOM) is an Australian educational program developed especially, but not exclusively, for talented and creative students across all sectors of primary and secondary school education. It provides a dynamic approach to learning, whilst developing students' enthusiasm for experimentation, problem finding and problem-solving. It is a not-for-profit organisation run by a voluntary committee.

Students are formed into vertically grouped team structures at Primary and Secondary levels, and undertake one of the four discipline groups: STEM, The Arts, Language Literature, and Social Sciences.

The team members work together for six weeks - without assistance from teachers, parents or peers - to develop a creative way to communicate their solution to a panel of judges and an audience, working within pre-determined parameters, complex criteria and the deadline of Tournament Day. The teams must also participate in an unseen Spontaneous Challenge® on the day.

Tournament of Minds is held annually and is conducted in three stages: Regional Tournaments, State Final Tournament (late August/early September), and Australasian Pacific Final (October)

TOM provides a rare opportunity for students with a passion for learning and problem-solving to demonstrate their creative skills and talents in an exciting, vibrant and public way. An expression of interest is asked from all years groups, for the school to register a team(s) for the Tournament. Permission notes and other information documents can be collected from Staffroom-3 during recess or lunchtimes.

We look forward to your son's participation in this exciting opportunity at our school. Further information will be made available as we compete.

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Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT)

Dear Parents and Students,

The Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT) competition is a one-hour problem solving competition designed to encourage student curiosity and promote multiple modes of thinking.

Students do not need computer programming ability, but the competition will help identify students' computer programming potential – something that you might not normally have the opportunity to demonstrate.

The competition is an ideal activity to encourage students to solve real-world problems. It is suitable for any mathematics class and the process helps students become more confident as they take on interesting new challenges.

The competition has a mixture of multiple-choice and integer answers and incorporates unique 'three-stage tasks' that encourage students to develop informal algorithms and apply them to test data of increasing size or complexity. Some questions test the ability to perform procedures, others require logical thought, while the more challenging problems require the identification and application of algorithms.

The Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT) will be held on Tuesday 23 March to Thursday 25 March 2021.

Students interested in participating in the challenge, please come to staffroom-3 during recess or lunchtimes to collect a form from Ms. Kounsal. The competition attracts a fee of \$6.50 which should be paid to the office by 12th March 2021.

There are resources (past papers) that you can collect to practice for the challenge, but as stated before, it requires no prior knowledge of computing.

We look forward to your participation in this exciting opportunity. Further information will be presented as we progress through the past papers.
