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

Welcome to another edition of "Author of the Month".

This is the last edition of the year so we are picking an author who has left a legacy in the Australian literary landscape, as we reflect the legacy of many towards the end of 2022: Patrick White (28 May 1912 – 30 September 1990).

Patrick White is one of the major English language writers of the second half of the twentieth century, and still the grand old master of Australian literature. His strong narrative voice and his wrenching tales make him an always fascinating read. White's books evolved from the very traditional to, ultimately, the very experimental. Even in his early work he is resolutely modern, trying to do more with fiction than most novelists care or dare to.

His novels are deceptive, with their weight and their stories, which are frequently placed earlier in this century - or in the last. White wrestles with the profound questions of our age, never opting for the easy answers (there are no "happy endings" or even truly positive resolutions in his work). He gives the reader food for thought - often, it seems, too much for comfort.

In 1973 he was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature, "for an epic and psychological narrative art which has introduced a new continent into literature", as it says in the Swedish Academy's citation, the only Australian to have been awarded the prize, until John Maxwell Coetzee in 2003. White was also the inaugural recipient of the Miles Franklin Award in 1957, and again in 1961.





This valuable and worthwhile sporting event is an integral part of the sporting calendar and we request your son's attendance and participation.

Event: Randwick Boys' High School Swimming Carnival **Date:** Thursday 2nd February 2023 (Day 3 of the school year) **Venue:** Des Renford Aquatic Centre, Maroubra, NSW

Cost: \$10 for bus & pool entry payable to the office by no later than Wednesday 1^{st} February 2023. Alternatively, students can make their own way to the venue and pay a \$5 entry fee collected at the pool

Departure: Bus departs promptly at 8:50am from school, if making your own way, ensure you arrive to the pool before 9am **Return:** To school at approximately 2:30pm, students will be dismissed upon return.

For those students who have paid to go via bus, this bus will depart from school promptly at 8:50am and return at approximately 2:30pm. Please note that if payment has not been made by Wednesday 1st February (the day before the carnival), your son will not be able to travel by hired bus organised by the school. Payments can be made in 2022.

It is also recommended that students bring food for the day, a water bottle, sunscreen and a hat, shading is limited. Drink breaks will be provided throughout the day and the canteen will be also be open to purchase food. Please do not bring valuables e.g. phone, tablets, large sums of money etc. Sunscreen to be applied regularly.

There will be an opportunity for students to swim in a non-competitive environment. The 'turtle lane' will open at certain stages to promote students who attend, encourage participation in the water under teacher supervision.

The Australian Federal Police through the <u>Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation</u> is seeing a concerning global trend of teenage males being targeted to send explicit images of themselves and then blackmailed. This is called sexual extortion, or sextortion.

The AFP is urging families to have important safety conversations ahead of the school holidays to prevent young people from becoming victim. This crime can have serious wellbeing and psychological impacts.

How does sextortion start?

- Unsolicited friend and follow requests on social media
- Direct messages on one app and then being asked to keep chatting on a secondary app
- Conversations suddenly and quickly becoming sexualised
- Requests for sexualised images or content.

What can families do?

- Have open and regular conversations about your child's online activities and interactions
- Know what platforms, apps and games they are using and who they are interacting with
- Remain open and approachable, victims will be reluctant to come forward if they feel they will be punished or blamed
- Ensure your child knows that it is okay to leave conversations if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe
- Support your child and know how to respond. The <u>Online blackmail and sexual extortion</u> response kit has been created to recognise sextortion and get help.

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

We're upgrading Randwick Boys High School and Randwick Girls High School to provide modern facilities and improve educational outcomes for the school community. The delivery of these projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students.

The upgrade to Randwick Boys High School will deliver upgraded science labs, a Fitness Learning Hub and new Technology and Applied Sciences (TAS) facilities.

The upgrade to Randwick Girls High School will deliver refurbished TAS facilities, a new woodwork learning workshop, enhanced library facilities and an administration reconfiguration that involves relocating the school entry.

In addition to the upgrades, other improvements will be made to both campuses including toilet facilities, roof replacements, power supply, enhancements to the halls and upgrades to movement areas including covered walkways.

Progress summary

Randwick Boys High School:

The procurement process for a contractor to deliver the new Fitness Learning Hub is in progress. It is anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded before the end of Term 4 2022 to allow works to occur over the upcoming summer school holidays. At this stage, completion is scheduled for Term 1 2023.

Meanwhile, the procurement process for a contractor to deliver the science laboratory upgrades has been brought forward. It is now anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded in January 2023. The delivery of the upgrades will occur during Term 1. The works will be staged to minimise disruption to school operations as much as possible.

Planning for the electricity upgrade is ongoing. Negotiations with Level 3 electrical contractors and the energy authority are in progress.

Randwick Girls High School:

The construction contract for the new woodwork learning workshop has recently been awarded. Works are expected to commence over the next few weeks with most of the construction taking place during the school holidays. The completion date is scheduled for the start of Term 1 2023.

Planning for the Food Technology facilities upgrades is underway. It is anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded during Term 1 2023. The delivery of the upgrades will occur during Terms 1 and 2. The works will be staged to minimise disruption to school operations as much as possible.

Next Steps

Randwick Boys High School:

- Commencement of the electricity upgrade during Terms 1 and 2.
- Commencement of planning for the delivery of the Food Technology upgrade.

Randwick Girls High School:

- Upgrades to the library are planned for Terms 3 and 4.
- The Administration facility upgrade is scheduled for the December 2023/January 2024 school holiday period.

Maintenance work

Additional maintenance works will be taking place at both schools over the next few months. These works are part of each school's annual maintenance provision and will be delivered in addition to the upgrade program. The type of works covered by the maintenance program typically include but are not restricted to roof replacements, asphalt repairs, painting and carpet and vinyl floor replacement. The Sydney Asset Management Unit will be co-ordinating both programs of work to ensure that there are no scheduling issues.

Project updates will be provided each term and / or ahead of key activities on site such as main works construction starting. These will be shared with the Principal to distribute via school channels, and uploaded onto the project webpage. 

Map of upgrades to Randwick Girls High School



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


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
