




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From the Principal
































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AROUND THE GROUNDS

Randwick Boys' compete in the Sydney North Metropolitan Dstrict. Sydney North spans from Homebush, all the way to the far North Central Coast.

Randwick is a school of around 700 students. On a weekly basis we compete against schools with enrolments as large as 1500 students. Despite this, Randwick continually punches far above its own weight.

Not often enough do these special athletes get the recognition that they deserve. Representing the school comes with great sacrifice - late afternoons and early morning training sessions, missed lunchtimes with their friends in the playground; all with the aim of representing our school with pride and honour to achieve sporting success.



As the Sports Coordinator and a proud past grade sports coach, I have had the absolute pleasure of working alongside these students and witnessing their sporting success from the front row.

Sport is an integral part of growing up. It teaches you how to lose. It builds resilience. It allows you to see the importance of working in a team.

2022 was a challenging year still dealing with the remnants of a worldwide pandemic. Unfortunately, this had major impacts on our regular sporting carnivals and our grade sport competitions.

Both swimming and athletics carnivals were forced to be shifted to competitors only. Summer grade sport for the 2021/2022 season was also cancelled.





Despite this, the young men sitting amongst us today rose above these challenges and produced fantastic achievements on the sporting fields and in the water. Epitomising what it means to be a Randwick Boy.

Our opens football team, led by Mr Maunder, constantly prevailed over persistent challenges from other CHS schools. Out of 350 schools, Randwick Boys' made it down to the last two, seeing their journey start out at Pennant Hills, through to Wagga and ultimately Seymour Shaw stadium - what an achievement.





Our opens rugby team made it 2 Randwick Boys' teams in a state-wide knockout competition final. Although suffering a narrow defeat in the final to a strong Hunter Valley Grammar side, Randwick Boys' finished as the top ranked CHS Rugby Union side in the state.

Success also came to individuals at our school. There were representatives at the highest level of school sport in form of Australian school boy golf representatives, Australian school boy water polo players, NSW all school's rugby union representatives, Australian champions in Maui Thai, bronze medallists in the Australian golden gloves boying championships just to name a



gloves boxing championships, just to name a few.

As we move forward towards a post pandemic world of school sport, I couldn't be prouder to be the Sports Coordinator of the men sitting with us today.

2023 looks an exciting year already with the following teams progressing to the semi finals of the 2022/23 Summer sport season: opens basketball, junior basketball, futsal 14's, opens league tag, junior league tag, opens volleyball and junior volleyball.




CBP2022 GRANT SUCCESS | \$136,000 FOR RBHS LIBRARY!

This valuable and worthwhile sporting event is an integral part of the sporting calendar and we request your son's attendance and participation.

Event: Randwick Boys' High School Swimming Carnival Date: Thursday 2nd February 2023 (Day 3 of the school year) Venue: Des Renford Aquatic Centre, Maroubra, NSW

Cost: \$10 for bus & pool entry payable to the office by no later than Wednesday 1st February 2023. Alternatively, students can

make their own way to the venue and pay a \$5 entry fee collected at the pool

Departure: Bus departs promptly at 8:50am from school, if making your own way, ensure you arrive to the pool before 9am

Return: To school at approximately 2:30pm, students will be dismissed upon return.

For those students who have paid to go via bus, this bus will depart from school promptly at 8:50am and return at approximately 2:30pm. Please note that if payment has not been made by Wednesday 1st February (the day before the carnival), your son will not be able to travel by hired bus organised by the school. Payments can be made in 2022.

It is also recommended that students bring food for the day, a water bottle, sunscreen and a hat, shading is limited. Drink breaks will be provided throughout the day and the canteen will be also be open to purchase food. Please do not bring valuables e.g. phone, tablets, large sums of money etc. Sunscreen to be applied regularly.

There will be an opportunity for students to swim in a non-competitive environment. The 'turtle lane' will open at certain stages to promote students who attend, encourage participation in the water under teacher supervision.

Vouchers can go towards the cost of school uniforms, shoes, bags, textbooks, or stationery purchased from registered businesses. You can apply for the vouchers via the Service NSW app, and for more information, visit service.nsw.gov.au, call 13 77 88 or attend a Service NSW Centre.

This new program is part of our plan to give families a more secure financial start to the year.

It has been fantastic to see so many students back in the classroom and thriving in 2022 after so many disruptions, and 2023 is shaping up to be an even bigger year for education in NSW.

We're rolling out a new, back-to-basics curriculum; making changes so students are even better prepared for employment and further education; doing more to recognise and reward our best teachers; and making it easier for parents to connect with your children's education.

It's all about taking those important steps to make NSW education the best it can be, so we can set up our children for future success.

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

We're upgrading Randwick Boys High School and Randwick Girls High School to provide modern facilities and improve educational outcomes for the school community. The delivery of these projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students.

The upgrade to Randwick Boys High School will deliver upgraded science labs, a Fitness Learning Hub and new Technology and Applied Sciences (TAS) facilities.

The upgrade to Randwick Girls High School will deliver refurbished TAS facilities, a new woodwork learning workshop, enhanced library facilities and an administration reconfiguration that involves relocating the school entry.

In addition to the upgrades, other improvements will be made to both campuses including toilet facilities, roof replacements, power supply, enhancements to the halls and upgrades to movement areas including covered walkways.

Progress summary

Randwick Boys High School

The procurement process for a contractor to deliver the new Fitness Learning Hub is in progress. It is anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded before the end of Term 4 2022 to allow works to occur over the upcoming summer school holidays. At this stage, completion is scheduled for Term 1 2023.

Meanwhile, the procurement process for a contractor to deliver the science laboratory upgrades has been brought forward. It is now anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded in January 2023. The delivery of the upgrades will occur during Term 1. The works will be staged to minimise disruption to school operations as much as possible.

Planning for the electricity upgrade is ongoing. Negotiations with Level 3 electrical contractors and the energy authority are in progress.

Randwick Girls High School

The construction contract for the new woodwork learning workshop has recently been awarded. Works are expected to start over the next few weeks with most of the construction taking place during the school holidays. We expect the new workshop will be ready for students to use for the start of Term 1 2023.

Planning for the Food Technology facilities upgrades is underway. It is anticipated that a construction contract will be awarded during Term 1 2023. The delivery of the upgrades will occur during Terms 1 and 2. The works will be staged to minimise disruption to school operations as much as possible.

Next steps

Randwick Boys High School

- Start electrical upgrade works during Terms 1 and 2 2023.
- Start planning for the delivery of the Food Technology upgrade.

Randwick Girls High School

- Upgrades to the library are planned for Terms 3 and 4 2023.
- The Administration facility upgrade is scheduled for the December 2023/January 2024 school holiday period.

Maintenance work

Additional maintenance works will be taking place at both schools over the next few months. These works are part of each school's annual maintenance provision and will be delivered in addition to the upgrade program. The type of works covered by the maintenance program typically include but are not restricted to roof replacements, asphalt repairs, painting and carpet and vinyl floor replacement. The local Asset Management team will be co-ordinating both programs of work to ensure that there are no scheduling issues.



Construction Update

In late November, the new Prince of Wales Hospital (POWH) Acute Services Building (ASB) celebrated major construction completion, marking just over four years of construction.

Alongside finishing touches on the new ASB, main works are continuing to progress on the site of the Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (SCH1/MCCCC).

Upcoming activities

Prince of Wales Hospital Acute Services Building

The POWH ASB will open to patients from early 2023.

In preparation for the transition into the new building, the project team continues to work closely with South Eastern Sydney Local Health District teams to support an extensive program of commissioning activities

In mid-December, the ASB tower crane will be dismantled, weather permitting.

External landscaping, along with construction of the UNSW Eastern Extension, continues until early 2023.

Prince of Wales Hospital Emergency Department

The POWH Emergency Department (ED) will be moving to the new ASB in early 2023.

The new ED drop-off and pick-up zone, along with limited short-stay parking, will be accessed off Magill Street, via Botany Street.

The existing ED located adjacent to the Barker Street entrance to POWH will close on this day.

Detailed information regarding the ED and other department and service moves, including move dates, will soon be available on the POWH website and at the hospital entrance information desks.

Holiday period site closure

Following a busy year of construction, our project sites will be closed for the festive season holiday period. The POWH ASB site will be closed from **6pm Thursday 22 December and reopen 7am Wednesday 4 January 2023**, and the SCH1/MCCCC site will be closed from **6pm Friday 23 December and reopen 7am Monday 9 January 2023**.

No work will be undertaken while the site is closed and security patrols will be in place to maintain site security and safety.





Community Notice: Randwick Campus Redevelopment

Sydney Children's Hospital Stage 1 and Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre

Initial main works activities, including piling and bulk excavation, will be underway until the end of the year.

Alongside works on site, the project team continues to consult with hospital staff and stakeholders to finalise the interior design, architecture and services elements of the new building.

Construction of a new prototype space is also underway to facilitate scenario testing prior to the main works completion.

Botany Street signalised intersection

Construction continues on the new signalised intersection on Botany Street to support safe pedestrian and vehicle access to both the Randwick Hospitals Campus and the UNSW Kensington Campus.

The majority of this work is being undertaken at night in line with Transport for NSW and Department of Planning and Environment authority approvals, and with ongoing consultation with impacted stakeholders.

Pedestrian and vehicular access will be maintained at all times through traffic control.

Botany Street footpath

Works to complete the new footpath, kerb and gutter at the main entrance to the ASB are underway along Botany Street.

There will be minimal impacts to vehicles, bikes and pedestrian access. When required, access will be maintained via traffic control.

Managing construction activities

We are committed to minimising the impact of our works.

All construction activities are carried out with the health and safety of the local community and site workers as our top priority. We endeavour to keep noise, dust and vibration to a minimum.

Where possible, activities are scheduled during approved site hours of Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm and Saturday, 8am to 5pm.

Work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances such as workforce availability. Any out of hours work will continue to be communicated directly to affected stakeholders in advance.
