It says a great deal about our school and the students we are lucky enough to educate in more than just academics. Enjoy!

"Dear Mr. Raskall,

I visited your school today, to observe one of the USYD prac students you are currently hosting. That student is working with your PDHPE staff and I was in your Gym. The student is actually irrelevant to what I saw.

At lesson change over, I observed some of your older boys leaving the gym and a very upset tear stained Year 7 boy coming in. I don't know who either of these chaps is. One of your older boys, as he was leaving the gym, saw this little Year 7 boy, pulled him aside, very gently, bent down to his level and went through the whole "are you okay" routine, that we teach boys to ask. Found out what was wrong, gave the boy encouragement, a hug and went on his way. No fuss, no 'look at me', just beautifully pastoral.

I was able to point this out to your PE staff as it was happening and one of your staff intervened to find out if there was anything he could do. Turns out the Year 7 boy was upset over a Science mark.

It was the way your older boy dealt with the situation with such compassion, such kindness and with no fuss.

Coach Mr Bester urged the boys to organise their defence by communicating and marking up. He also encouraged the team to improve their speed to the ruck in order to protect the ball in attack.

Duke of Edinburgh News June 2022

Dear Parents and Students,

As you are aware, due to the recent NSW governments closure of all national park hiking trails, the Duke of Edinburgh adventure journeys planned for both last term and this term, have been postponed. The governments decision was triggered by an unfortunate incident when a family was hiking in the Blue Mountains National Park, because of a landslide. All trails have closed since late March due to weather damage as a consequence.

Earlier this year, many students and their parents decided to register and make payment for their sons to participate in various levels of the program. The postponement of the various adventure journeys has caused unexpected disappointment and confusion as to what happens next. Unfortunately, we are still waiting on the relevant authorities to re-open the hiking trails. At this point in time, it is not clear when these trails will be declared safe to do so. Be assured that as soon as they are re-open, we will do our best to undertake the postponed journeys.

I would like to assure you that things will eventually return to normal. This may occur in the very near future and it is highly likely that we will be completing at least one journey at each level of the Duke of Edinburgh program sometime soon. In the meantime, students should continue to engage with the program by completing the remaining components: Service; Skill; and Physical Recreation. I highly recommend that you stay committed to completing the program - you will get it done. In the worst-case scenario, where no journeys are undertaken, participants can choose to attempt a higher-level next year with no further registration costs.

The Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) has been held annually since 1978, Your child is invited to enter this internationally recognised competition.

One of the largest annual events on the Australian education calendar, the AMC was the first competition of its kind in Australia and is now one of the largest of its type in the world. More than 30 countries participate each year.

It is an engaging 30-problem competition that demonstrates the importance and relevance of mathematics in students' everyday lives. The competition aims to be accessible to all students from years 3 to 12, not just the mathematically gifted. There is an emphasis on problem solving, a valuable life skill, and the questions are designed to be fun for the student. Time allowed is 75 minutes for the secondary papers.
