# Reporting on the Honour Roll

The RBHS Honour Roll is a board of names of graduated students from Randwick Superior School (Randwick Boys' High School's predecessor) who enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force during the First World War. The students in 10 Extension History have been researching some of these old boys using the Australian War Memorial website to see if we can find the person who went to our old school, and share information about them starting with only their surname and first initial.

We started by putting in their names. My chosen name being Q Bone in the people search option on the AWM website. Then, using the honour roll, we would search through the names to see which person was from Randwick Superior School. Luckily, there was only one person that came up with this name - Quintin Bone.

After that we could get some information through clicking on the link that is their name with the AWM's features, which allows a few details to be shown about the soldier, such as his service number (3774) and rank (private). We also looked at the National Australian Archives, which used a more in-depth form of data collection, because it would find a person for the war and compiles many sheets of primary documents regarding the individual, ranging from personal information, registration sheets and information dictating their duties and experiences during service.



I first had to establish whether I had the correct record of the person I was researching. I attempted to find this information by using the National Australian Archives to determine his identity. I worked out the person I was searching for had enlisted under the very generic name of Robert Campbell, but the fact of the matter is that he is the only one under the name of Quintin Bone, and there is a person with that name on the honour roll, so I concluded that it must be him. I also discovered that later he filled out official forms to fully recognise that his name is Quintin Bone. It is a mystery why he enlisted under a completely different name than the one he later used. He must have been hiding his true identity when he signed up.

Fortunately, there were records dictating that he had returned to Australia but not much more. It was also lucky that there were a few pieces of information surrounding Bone, such as his pay rate and the ship on which he had embarked to go to war. I was also able to find some records of the places he served in the 30<sup>th</sup> Battalion.

This task was quite fascinating as I was able to look into the past of not only WWI, but a very personal look of someone who had attended the predecessor school of Randwick Boys' High School. I learned a great deal of information about the individual I researched and enjoyed it thoroughly.

## Behavioural Economics Lecture by Dr Marjorie Spooner O'Neill for Year 11 Economics

On Friday, 29 September, Dr Marjorie O'Neill [BA, BBus(Hons), PhD] MP attended Randwick Boys' High School to deliver a 50 minute lecture to Year 11 Economics students on the subject of Behavioural Economics. The focus of the lecture were two case studies that are currently being debated by Members of Parliament that demonstrated how economic policies can shape social outcomes. The two case studies were fascinating. As a regulatory issue Dr O'Neill debated the causes of gender inequality in superannuation. As an issue of fiscal policy, Dr O'Neill examined the positive and negative effects of the current cap on government subsidy for childcare places.

All students were engaged, enthused, and exhilarated by the presentation and the debates involved. As part of the Year 11 course, this was a real-life exercise in economic thinking with a member of parliament who debates and creates these policies. Dr Marjorie O'Neill helped illuminate the effect of government policies, both fiscal and regulatory, in a way that will hopefully inspire students to continue in this field.

It was a fantastic experience all round.



## VALID SCIENCE 10

The *Validation of Assessment 4 Learning & Individual Development (VALID)* test for Year 10 students will be held at Randwick Boys' High School on:  
**Monday August 29, during periods 1 and 2.**

At Randwick Boys' High, students who receive special provisions when attempting exams, usually go to the ILC for separate, small group supervision. They may also receive extra time to complete the exam. These students have been given a consent form to take home. This form must be signed by a parent and returned to Ms Betros as soon as possible.

Closer to the date of the exam, the Year 10 students will receive information about which computer room they will go to. All students are expected to bring headphones that can be plugged into a computer. Stores like Kmart and The Reject Shop sell headphones for as little as \$2. *Airpods and wireless headphones must not be brought to the exam room.*

Students will be given the opportunity to do practice exams in school time.

Dear Year 10 Parent or Carer

The *Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development* (VALID) test for Year 10 students will be held between **Monday 29 August** and **Friday 9 September 2022**. The test takes approximately 75 minutes. The **VALID Science 10** test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer.

*VALID Science 10* contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 5 outcomes and essential content in the *NSW Science Years 7–10 Syllabus (2018)*. Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes, and values about science.

*VALID Science 10* contains audio, so each student needs to bring suitable **headphones or earbuds** that connect to a device. Schools will indicate if students need their own device.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact your child's school to discuss special provisions or exemption from the test.

Results of the test will be available during Term 4, 2022. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personalised electronic report describing the knowledge and skills demonstrated by your child in the test will be available from their school. There will also be information about how your child's results compare with overall performance of all students in the test across NSW.

The principal of your child's school can provide you with more details about the VALID program if you require additional information.



